

The Atlantic Canada Fish Farmers Association Salmon Research Award was established in honour of Betty House whose passion for and dedication to salmon in Atlantic Canada was marked by her 20+ year career in the salmon aquaculture industry and her role in the Inner Bay of Fundy Salmon Recovery Project.

AWARD CRITERIA

The \$2000 annual award is presented to a post secondary student who is making contributions to research in fish health, nutrition, innovation, genetics, and/or technologies that contribute to Atlantic salmon rearing, stocking, or conservation. Recipients will be notified by July 1 and formally presented with the award at the Annual Fall Forum hosted by the Atlantic Canada Fish Farmers Association.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Recipient must:

- Be a fulltime student enrolled in a post secondary academic institution in Atlantic Canada
- Be conducting a relevant research project undertaken within the last twelve months
- Show research projects are part of credit courses and demonstrate how they are or will move beyond the classroom in an essay format no more than 800 - 1000 words.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION

Must include:

- Cover Letter: A cover letter outlining why your nomination should be considered (25%)
- Project Outline: An outline of the relevant project that serves to illustrate how the nominee embodies the specific award and eligibility criteria (50%)
- Letters of support from at least two of the following: (25%)
 - Student organization members; and/or relevant community organization
 - Faculty, staff and others who support this nomination
- Other documentation to support the nomination package (Examples: resume, quotes, emails, newspaper articles, letters, etc.) (optional)
